CCPS History



- Created in 1977
- Consolidated key state law enforcement and emergency response agencies into one department
- Designated North Carolina's lead homeland security agency in 2001

CCPS Organization



- One of 10 Cabinet agencies
- Secretary appointed by the Governor
- Ten divisions
- 3,000 full time employees
- 12,000 National Guard members

Law Enforcement



■ Alcohol Law Enforcement

- 115 agents/statewide jurisdiction
- Enforces alcohol, tobacco, lottery and drug laws with special emphasis on keeping teens substance-free
- Oversees 44,000+ alcohol permits issued to 17,000+ outlets
- N.C. Center for Missing Persons oversees the AMBER Alert and Silver Alert systems

Law Enforcement

- Butner Public Safety

- 44 sworn officers
- Dual certification, both police and fire
- Serves residents, private industry, patients and inmates in state and federal institutions in the 36-square mile area of Butner in Granville County



Law Enforcement

- State Highway Patrol
 - State's largest law enforcement agency
 - 1,800+ sworn members
 - 300+ civilian support staff
 - Enforces motor vehicles laws on more than 78,000 miles of state highways



Law Enforcement



- State Capitol Police
 - 58 sworn officers
 - 19 non-sworn security guards
 - Provides protection for public officials, state employees and visitors within the North Carolina State Government Complex and at state-owned properties

Emergency Response

- Emergency Management

- 166 employees
- Coordinates the State

Emergency Response Team

- Lead agency for planning, training, response and mitigation of natural and manmade disasters
- Administers federal homeland security funds



Emergency Response

- National Guard
 - 1,700 full time federal & state employees
 - 11,000 part time soldiers & airmen
 - State mission: disaster response
 - Federal mission: national defense
 - Since 9-11, more than 9,000 NC Guard members have been federally activated



Emergency Response

■ Civil Air Patrol

- 2 full time employees
- 2,000 volunteers and cadets
- Official auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force
- Search and rescue, disaster response, aerospace education
- Cadet Program Initiative is the largest in the U.S.



Criminal Justice Support

- Governor's Crime Commission
 - 33 employees
 - Advisor to Governor and Secretary on criminal justice issues
 - Includes statistical analysis center and crime prevention section
 - Administers \$25+ million annually in federal grants



Criminal Justice Support

- Law Enforcement Support Services
 - 5 employees
 - Military surplus property and equipment loans for law enforcement



Criminal Justice Support

- Victims Compensation Services

- 13 employees

- Provides financial assistance to innocent crime victims

- Crime Victims Compensation Fund

- Pays up to \$30,000 for medical expenses and/or lost wages and up to \$5,000 for funerals

- Rape Victims Assistance Program

- Pays for rape kit and forensic medical exam at hospitals
